Teen Volunteer Program

There are several teen volunteer opportunities through the Recreation and Community Services Department, including the popular “Teens in Lakewood Care” (TLC) program. Teens must be at least 12 years of age and have an interest in helping the community. Teen volunteer applications and projects are available at the TRC and LYC. TLC dates: July 27 and October 12. **All teen volunteers must complete a Live Scan fingerprint and background screening process prior to volunteering in this program. A parent/guardian signed release is required to complete the Live Scan process.*

TEEN RESOURCE CENTER

The Teen Resource Center (TRC) provides five computer workstations, a comfortable reading area, a commercial grade air hockey table, ping-pong, gaming systems, and a low cost snack bar for teens to get refreshed. The computers are intended to help students complete homework assignments and research college and career opportunities. Staff are trained to assist participants with assignments and programs when needed. The TRC also seeks to provide a fun and safe social outlet for Lakewood’s youth, including gaming tournaments, sports competition, and movie nights.
